Celebrating Nurses and Rockville Nursing Home Staff: Close to our Hearts

In the month of May, we were excited to have had two full weeks to recognize our nurses and nursing home staff as we celebrated the impact they make every day! The celebration began with National Nurses' Week, which was from May 6th to the 12th, and was followed by National Skilled Nursing Care Week on May 13th to the 19th.

A national day of recognition for nurses in the United States was originally celebrated in 1954, the year marking the 100th anniversary of Florence Nightingale's mission to Crimea. President Reagan officially signed a proclamation in 1982 for May 6th to be "National Recognition Day for Nurses," and later it was expanded to a week-long celebration with a permanent end date of May 12th, Florence Nightingale's birthday.



Given the breadth of roles that individuals in the nursing profession hold, the American Nurses Association announced a fitting theme for 2018, "Nurses: Inspire. Innovate. Influence."

National Skilled Nursing Care Week, formerly known as National Nursing Home Week, was established in 1967 by the American Health Care Association. The week-long celebration recognizes the crucial role of skilled nursing care centers throughout the country. The 2018 theme is "Celebrating Life's Stories," highlighting the relationships and shared experiences cultivated by staff, residents, and families in long term and post-acute care.
